What is BAP all about ?

Build Alaigbo Project (BAP) is a crowdfunding drive to develop Alaigbo managed by ADAI. We intend to leverage the power of 'igwe bu ike' to execute key projects as we have done in the past post-civil war.

Alaigbo has huge potential but is currently shackled by poor infrastructure. We can address this gap by collectively working together.

Projects have been selected using online polls and we plan to execute these projects in phases based on funding and impact on communities.

Alaigbo under BAP includes all 5 states of the SE, and all other Igbo communities outside these states.





Why crowdfund?

The infrastructural deficit in Alaigbo is so immense and could take decades to bridge. We do not have the luxury of time to wait that long while the rest of the world moves on.

History has shown that Igbos have the capacity to successfully crowdfund with the rebuild after the civil war and most notably the construction of the Owerri Airport under Sam Mbakwe's leadership as great examples.

Coming together to build critical infrastructure will ensure Alaigbo is at pace with the rest of the world and allow us leverage our resources sustainably.

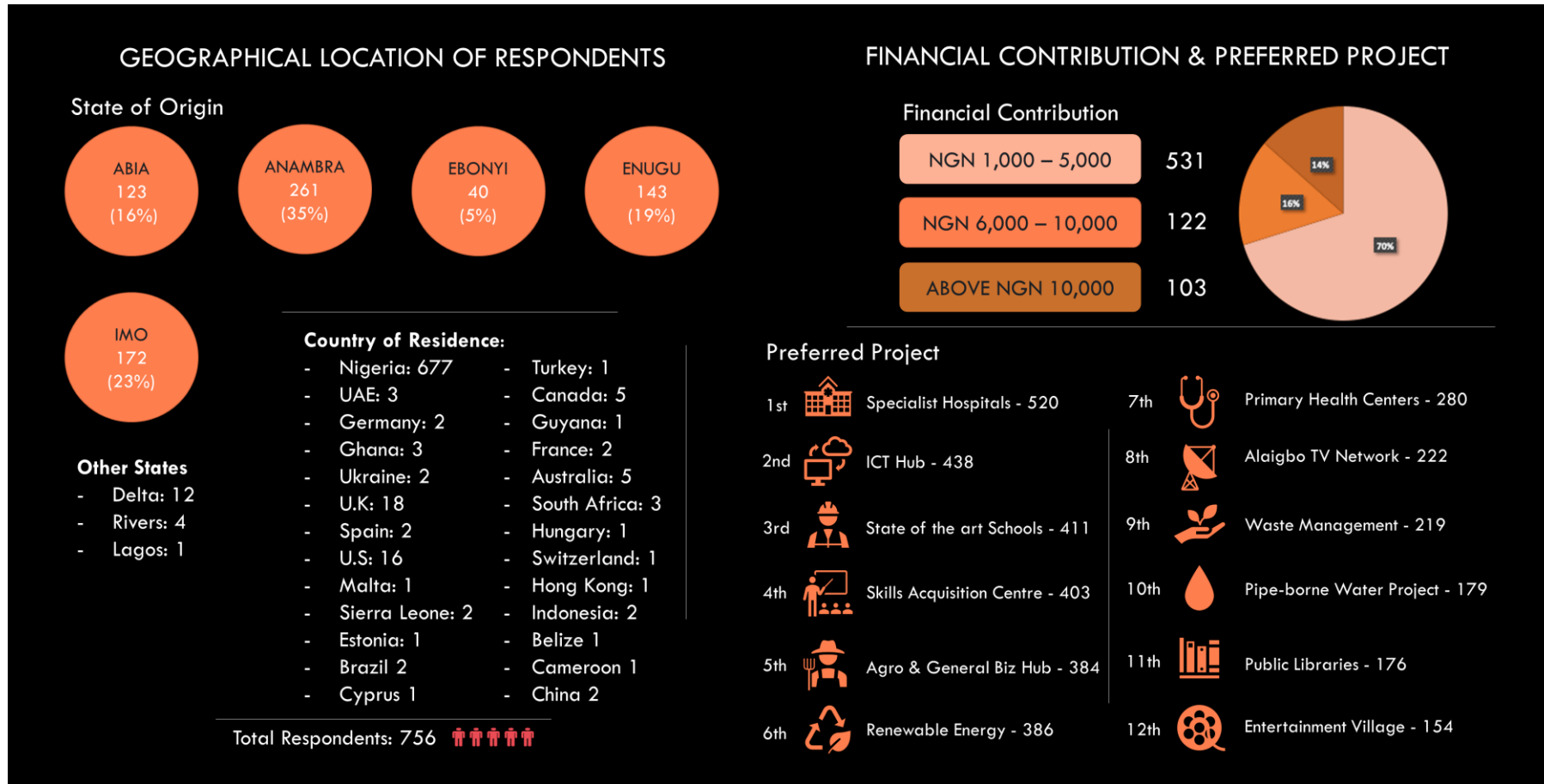


SAM MBAKWE INTERNATIONAL CARGO AIRPORT OWERRI

The following projects are slated for phase 1:

- Primary health centers
- Solar powered boreholes
- Modern libraries

Our approach will involve renovating existing structures or building from scratch if need be.

As we continue to crowdfund, we will explore completing more of these projects in communities that need them.

Primary Health Centers

Alaigbo is littered with dilapidated health centers in rural areas which locals depend on for health care.

The state of these health centers pose a health hazard to locals making it difficult for them to quickly get medical help when they need it.

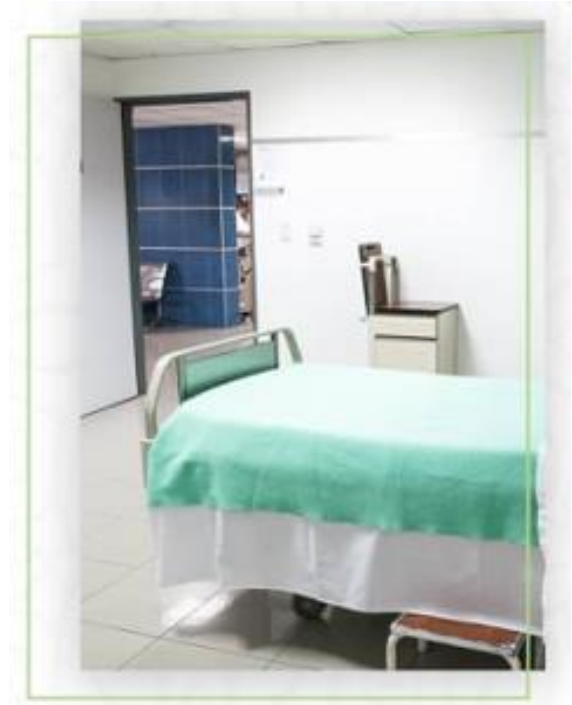
Revamping or building new primary health centers will go a long way to addressing this challenge.

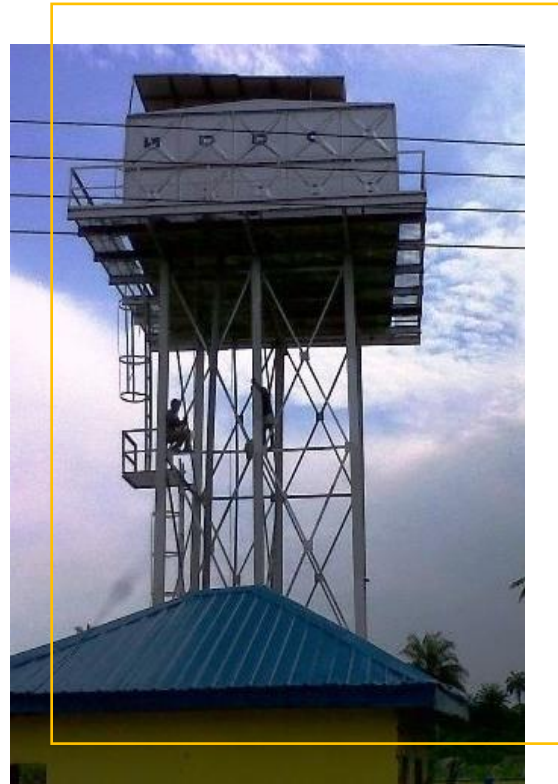

Solar Powered Boreholes

Many communities in Alaigbo do not have access to potable water. They usually travel long distances to get access to stream/river water which may be polluted.

As a vital resource for mankind, providing access to potable water is essential. We are planning on addressing this challenge through solar powered boreholes to ensure regular access to water for such communities.

These boreholes will come with water storage tanks, security, and multiple access points to serve many people at the same time.

Modern Libraries

As part of our efforts towards developing our human capital, education rests at the foundation. Providing access to information and knowledge via libraries will help the younger generation expand their knowledge base and imagination.

Currently, libraries across Alaigbo remain dilapidated due to lack of care and attention.

Our plan is to revamp existing libraries by renovating the structures, add new books, ICT equipment and internet access, and solar power to ensure all round electricity access.

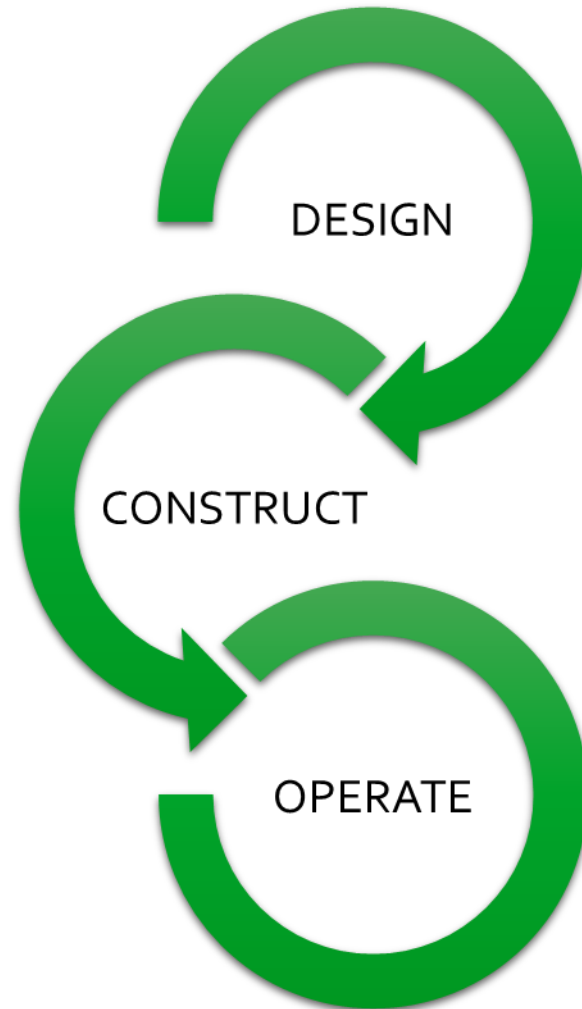

Management Structure

ADAI team will be in charge of designing and scoping the various projects. We will leverage the knowledge of professionals and information from existing projects.

The construction of these projects will be done by certified contractors and project managers will be assigned to manage the entire process.

Upon completion, these projects will be handed over to organizations, leadership groups, or individuals to operate. It will include churches, town unions, council of elders, or interested private citizens.
